NOTES:

- 1 Legal fees were higher in 2017 than in previous years, and reflect the costs associated with the need to review and update the Apra Canada Chapter By-Laws to align with the new B.C. Societies Act.
- 2 The net loss for 2017 is largely attributable to early expenses related to the upcoming Apra Canada 2018 Conference, which included down payments for the venue and keynote speaker. The Apra Canada chapter expects to recoup these expenses through conference attendance fees and sponsorships. When this \$15,145 in expenses are excluded, Apra Canada realized net income of \$1,922 in 2017.
